A Frame Boards – The Finance and Policy Committee would be asked to create a policy for use of the A frame boards

Public Art: Warth Park – The developer Roxhill is paying for a sculpture to be installed at Warth Park. Broadbent Studios who are working on the project will carry out a public consultation exercise in Saxon Hall, date tbc.

Stone Animals- Webb Road- The stone Animals that were previously located on the Square are to be re-located to Webb Road play area, Clerk to arrange with contractor.

Adult Gym Equipment: A leaflet will be distributed to every house in Raunds promoting the adult gym equipment.

25.19 Community Facilities Fund: To consider a project for the next round of the Community Facilities Fund

Members considered the criteria for the fund and the focus on healthy and active lifestyles. Following discussion, it was considered that a funding bid for the Woodland Walk should be made.

The Woodland Walk would be situated at the bottom of Amos Lawrence playing field and would include:

- Trees
- Paths
- Benches – carved and engraved
- Picnic Benches
- Mud Kitchen area

Local schools will be asked to get involved with the planting, the tree and landscape officer at East Northamptonshire Council will assist with planning the scheme.

RESOLVED that the Clerk will submit a bid to the Community Facilities Fund to support the development of a Woodland Walk.

26.19 Raunds Market: To consider extending the trial of the Saturday Market.

Members considered the feedback received during the ongoing trial. It was noted that feedback from both traders and the public had been very positive.

The number of stalls at each month's market was continuing to grow.

1.0	Background
1.1	<p>The Vision for Raunds In 2013 Raunds Town Council supported the community in the preparation of a community plan. "The Vision for Raunds". The plan saw questionnaires distributed to households, businesses and schools. The findings from this were presented in the community plan which was adopted by the Town Council in June 2014. The Vision for Raunds was later used to form the evidence base for the Raunds Neighbourhood Plan and later the Town Councils Business Plan.</p> <p>In December 2018 the council approved the development of a Vision for Raunds 2 community plan. A budget of £5,000 was set for the project and a working party was formed to develop the project plan.</p> <p>A launch meeting was held on March 28th and notes from this meeting have been circulated previously.</p> <p>A further meeting was held on 2nd May</p>
2.0	<p>Vision 2 Meeting 2nd May A round table discussion meeting was held on 2 May 2019 attended by 4 residents 6 councillors and the Clerk.</p> <p>The format for the evening was as follows: Review of outcome of brainstorming exercise held on 28 March 2019 Round table discussion</p>

During the round table discussion the following observations were made:

- Younger people are less likely than ever to attend meetings, they will want to engage through social media.
- We need to engage with people especially hard to reach groups where they are e.g.
 - Film afternoons
 - Schools
 - Carers -young carers
 - Use library
- Consideration was also given as to how to generate questions, it was suggested that a call to action be put in the Raunds Round-Up with reply slips being collected at the library.
- It was noted that parking was a high priority issue, it was agreed that it may not be possible for the council to increase the number of parking spaces in the town, but the availability of parking at Saxon Hall could be better advertised through use of the digital boards and signage.
- It was noted that intergenerational work such as community garden could support community cohesion and the integration of new people into the Town.
- A discussion was held around how to tackle issues where Raunds Town Council had no direct control e.g health services. It was agreed that RTC could only lobby on behalf of residents, but perhaps should look at being more involved in local health boards and patient forums. Consideration was also given to delivery of projects previously promised by developers and how to ensure their obligations are met. (E.g Roxhill BMX track and access from Meadow Lane to Amos Lawrence)
- A discussion was held about the format of the questionnaire and the difficulty of analysing open-ended questions.

The meeting closed with the group agreeing to meet again in early July and that in the meantime further consideration would be given to all the issues raised.

Meeting with Lucy Hawes 23/02/2019

Lucy Hawes is a community development officer, East Northamptonshire Council. Lucy met with the Clerk to catch up on work on the Vision and other projects:

During the discussion the following were suggested:

- Use social media as call for themes?
E.g. "We're working on questions for the Vision questionnaire and today we are focusing on litter....."
Facebook can provide a good straw poll of opinion to inform questionnaire
- Ask people to identify solutions, not just the issue –
- Tell people what we have done – "last time you said litter was an issue.. so we have done xyz...what else should we do.."
- Make it clear that some things will cost more. E.g. we could contract the dog warden to come to Raunds but this will cost xxx
- Use Maps – top three areas where dog waste is a problem
- Use instagram – dog poo, time date place!! Could also be a deterrent if people know we are recording this...
- ENC can give a tutorial in using Instagram, best way to engage with younger people.
- Create stickers with our instagram tag and put them in places where we know young people will be

1.0	<p><u>Background</u></p> <p>It has come to the attention of the Town Council that a number of areas of open space are no longer being maintained.</p> <p>These areas are not owned by the Town Council and have never been maintained by RTC.</p> <p>2 areas were previously maintained by ENC but have been removed from their contract for 2019/20 (see map 1)</p> <p>We are trying to establish who maintained the 3rd area, this may have been Spire Homes or ENC, but is no longer being maintained (map 2)</p>
