## Summary:

### 1.0 Background

The following enquiry has been received from a member of the public:

1. The litter being dropped on the London Road pathway leading to ASDA where there are no bins, also fallen branches from the trees on the edge of the ditch. I have mentioned the bins previously but still cannot see their existence.

2. The openings to cross Warth Park road to ASDA are placed in a dangerous position, i.e. too close to the roundabout from London Road, where you can't see the vehicles until they are on top of you and some drivers do not indicate as they come round the roundabout, also at the far end, too close to the corner where cars come speeding round from the factories.

My suggestion would be to place another opening halfway down the road, where you could safely see the cars/lorries before they get too close and without the fear of being knocked over..
